Beyond Blindness is recognized as a model of excellence in early intervention and is used as a training site for interns and residents from colleges and universities throughout Los Angeles and Orange County.
- Position Summary: Beyond Blindness is seeking a highly qualified and collaborative Teacher for Students with Vision Impairments (TVI) to join our team. This position provides direct and consultative services to children and students ages 0-22 with specialized vision services and works with school-based teams to address educational, communication, functional and social/emotional needs of students with visual impairments. This position will travel throughout Orange County to provide services to students in a variety of settings.
