Despite the challenges of a pandemic year, Beyond Blindness boldly implemented a plan to do more for children with visual impairments and other disabilities, and their families. We are proud of our many accomplishments this past year, including serving more children than ever before, forging more connections, and implementing a new, more comprehensive Journey of Care to shepherd families from their child's birth to early adulthood.

To signify a new era of innovation, we also rolled out a new name and brand, formally changing our name from Blind Children's Learning Center to Beyond Blindness. We collaborated with important stakeholders including families, our Board, and key partners to choose a name that conveys our guiding belief that children are capable of achievements far beyond the limitations of their diagnosis.

The need to evolve is constant. The record 312 families served during this time deserve an organization that can grow alongside them, and the families of tomorrow will need the same dedication.

Many of the children we serve today present more complex diagnoses, including visual deficits. To achieve their fullest potential, they require deeper, more continuous investment. The families raising these children also need more support, education, and counseling in order to thrive.

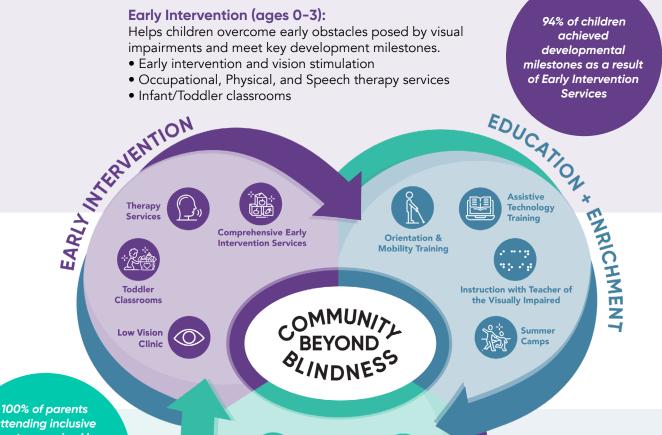

OPHTHALMIC ADVISORY BOARD FORMATION

The Ophthalmic Advisory Board commenced November 2020 to unite the best and brightest leaders in the vision care sector to advance Beyond Blindness' visibility and capacity to serve. Co-Chaired by Tom Frinzi, retired worldwide president of Johnson & Johnson Vision, and Dr. Sam Garg, medical director of UC Irvine's Gavin Herbert Eye Institute, the advisory board contributes expertise and resources to make Beyond Blindness the first choice for referrals, philanthropy, and volunteer leadership.

OCTANE FOUNDATION FOR INNOVATION

In Spring 2021, Beyond Blindness was one of five organizations selected to participate in Octane's Nonprofit Accelerator Program. The program is adapted from Octane's awardwinning tech and med-tech accelerator, LaunchPad SBDC, to help nonprofits further their impact to the community and increase their sustainability.





ROLL-OUT OF NEW NAME AND BRANDING

The new name Beyond Blindness, along with our updated logo, signifies our evolution and expansion to serve and positively impact a wider population of children with visual impairments and other disabilities and their families.

STRATEGIC BOARD DEVELOPMENT

To engineer a board that can effectively lead Beyond Blindness into the future, the current Board of Directors and key leaders participated in OneOC's Board Excellence Program. Additionally, Beyond Blindness participated in the pilot of OneOC's Volunteer Leadership Engagement to Achieve Diversity, or VILead, to develop a cohort of civic-minded leaders who represent and embrace the communities where we work and serve.





UNITING AGENCIES ACROSS CALIFORNIA

Beyond Blindness Executive Director Angie Rowe was a driving force as a founding board member who helped to launch a new non-profit in 2020, California Agencies for the Blind and Visually Impaired (CAABVI). Uniting 20 agencies across the state, it advocates for effective and equitable training, education, and services for all Californians who are blind or visually impaired.

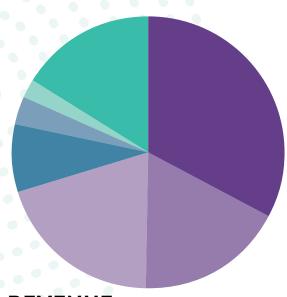

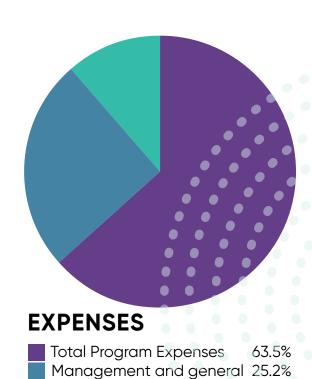
