Position Summary

Working as part of a team of professionals, the Early Childhood Classroom Teacher is responsible and accountable for overseeing the classroom environment and teaching children including preparation, instruction, evaluation, home visits, and parent conferences regarding children's goals and progress toward school readiness and success in life.

This job description is intended as a guide to the general job responsibilities.

Responsibilities

- Conducts screenings and ongoing assessments of infants and toddlers to determine motor, language, social, cognitive perceptual and emotional skills.
- Completes timely, neat, accurate documentation of screenings, assessments, individualized plans, attendance, daily health checklist, feedings, daily activity logs for parents, inventories, and other documentation as may be deemed necessary for providing quality services.
- Develops, plans, and implements daily lesson plans and activities. Prepares monthly activity calendar.
- Maintains regular communication with parents.
- Attend to health, safety, and hygiene of children.
- Ensures each child's needs are met appropriately by staff.
- Assists with toileting, bathroom, diaper needs, and other care as needed.
- Complies with organizational guidelines and HIPAA health care laws and regulations.
- Participates in training and attends all-staff meetings, as well as regular meetings with Supervisor.
- Other professional, job-related duties as assigned.

Licensing & Accreditation Requirements

All employees working for Beyond Blindness are required to meet the following at all times:

- LiveScan Fingerprint clearance and background check DOJ/FBI/Child Abuse Index (one time or upon re-hire)
- Health Screening (one time or upon re-hire)
- Proof of immunity to Measles or MMR Vaccination Record (one time)
- Flu Vaccine within one year (and each year thereafter)
- TDAP Vaccine within last 10 years (and every 10 years thereafter)
- Clear TB test or Chest X-ray within last 4 years (and every 4 years thereafter)
- Current up-to-date Credential, License, Certification or Units for employment
